May 27, 2019

As 15 tornadoes ripped through our communities, the Humane Society of Greater Dayton knew we needed to take charge in helping those affected by this devestation.

Our team immediately sprang into action to help those in need. We loaded up a fleet of cars and hit the pavement. We delivered food to food banks and help centers. We went door-to-door assisting residents who needed help in caring for their pets. We provided thousands of pounds of food and supplies as well as 385 free microchips to residents over the span of a month to ensure their pets were protected in the future.



August 4, 2019

In just mere seconds, tragedy struck the Oregon District in Downtown Dayton leaving nine dead and a city in shock. This senseless mass shooting left us all feeling helpless as we tried to grasp what we could do. Our community was hurting and we wanted to help, but how?

Just 24 hours after the shooting, we knew what we had to do. We set up in the heart of the Oregon District with a puppy, a kitten and one simple sign that read "Come Get Some Love from a Furry Friend." The emotions were still so raw. People wept as they held a puppy, but for a brief moment, they could relax and feel unconditional love.

March 24, 2020

In 2020, we have all stopped as COVID-19 spread across our cities, our nation, our world. Before the governor ordered the shutdown of our state, the Humane Society of Greater Dayton took the socially responsible approach and closed our doors through at least the end of March. The week leading up to the shutdown, we were only open to staff members and closed to public and volunteers to protect our community. During this time, we also found temporary foster homes for nearly 100% of the animals in our shelter. When the governor did close down the state, our shelter was ready and our staff could primarily work remotely to stay safe. In addition, we took our excess supplies of medical equipment and donated it to a medical facility that was in




Open Your Heart, Home to Babies


