ALTERNATE HOUSING EXPANDS REACH OF FOSTER PROGRAM

The Humane Society of Greater Dayton is thinking outside the box with their foster program by adding unconventional fostering homes to the mix.

These partnerships couldn't come at a more critical time for the Humane Society. During this year's breeding season, the Humane Society has had more than 300 animals in foster care at any given point. Seeking alternative foster homes was essential to support the increased number of animals, ultimately helping to free up more cage space and in turn help more pets find their forever homes. Currently, HSGD is partnering with two senior centers including Engaging Days Senior Enrichment Center in Englewood and The Patterson in Beavercreek. This innovative approach not only helps the Humane Society manage the influx of animals needing foster care but also enriches the lives of the seniors who interact with kittens at the facilities. The kittens receive constant attention and care, while the seniors benefit from the joy and companionship. This creative solution has shown firsthand how collaborating with other community groups can create a positive impact for both people and pets and we look forward to expanding this program further.

BRIDGING THE GAP

MORE THAN ANIMALS: BUILDING A STRONGER COMMUNITY TOGETHER

At the Humane Society of Greater Dayton, we believe the well-being of animals and humans are inextricably linked. We're not just here for the animals; we're here for the entire community. Our mission is to advance the health, welfare and safety of animals and people. By providing resources and support to pet owners, we're strengthening the bond between people and their pets, fostering healthier, happier communities.

HOW DO WE SUPPORT PEOPLE?

- Affordable Veterinary Care: Our veterinary hospital offers high-quality, low-cost care to help pet owners keep their companions healthy and out of shelters.
- Education and Training: We offer a variety of programs to educate about responsible pet ownership, including trainings, classes, our Book Buddies reading program and more.
- Support Services: We understand life can be challenging, and sometimes extra help is needed. Our One Health Program includes a licensed social worker who advocates for people in need, ensuring pet owners and their pets receive the necessary care and resources. Additionally, our Safe Pets Shelter Program collaborates with local domestic violence shelters to provide boarding for pets of those escaping violent situations.
- **Community Outreach:** We partner with local organizations like the Senior Resource Connection to provide pet food to Meals on Wheels participants. Our Pet Therapy program brings pets to senior centers, offering seniors companionship and interaction with animals.

HOW DO WE LEAD THE WAY IN ANIMAL WELFARE EACH YEAR?

- A No-Kill Animal Adoption Agency: We are proud to be the largest adoption agency in the Miami Valley helping nearly 2,500 animals find homes each year. We are also the only organization in the Miami Valley helping all types of animals find homes.
- Cruelty & Neglect Investigations: Each year, our humane society agents investigate hundreds of cases of cruelty and neglect toward all types of animals within Montgomery County.
- High-Volume Spay & Neuter Clinic: To battle overpopulation, our team performs nearly 8,000 spay and neuter surgeries each year for shelter animals, owned animals and community cats. By spaying or neutering these animals, we are ensuring they live a healthier, longer life while also stopping unwanted litters within our communities.
- Full-Service Veterinary Hospital: At our veterinary hospital we are able to provide low-cost, high-quality veterinary services to owned pets. Plus, with our financial payment plans, we will work to ensure all pets receive the care they need no matter the financial burdens owners may have.
- Community Cat Initiative: This program ensures community cat safety, combats overpopulation, and promotes spaying or neutering through Trap-Neuter-Return. Our Working Cats Program also provides safe, non-traditional shelters for community cats.
- Pet Enrichment and Socialization: From providing dog training, enrichment puzzles and excursions for our animals, we also have large Volunteering and Foster programs designed to help socialize and support the development of animals in our care through loving interactions.

JOFFREY FIGHTS FOR HIS LIFE

Earlier this summer, a small, innocent kitten endured the most unimaginable cruelty. This sweet kitten, which we named Joffrey, was deliberately set on fire by a hateful heart and continues to fight for his life. The man responsible for this horrendous act has been indicted and is currently in jail, facing several felony and misdemeanor charges. While the courts deal with him, we have a more pressing situation at hand: saving the life of the innocent kitten who happened to be in the wrong place at the wrong time.

Joffrey arrived to the Humane Society of Greater Dayton in critical condition, suffering from severe burns and wounds. Our dedicated team immediately began round-the-clock care, providing pain relief, changing bandages, and performing essential procedures to stabilize him. Despite our best efforts, Joffrey needed specialized care. On July 18th, we transferred him to The Ohio State University Veterinary Center, where he has undergone two surgeries to treat his wounds and repair his burnt ears. Unfortunately, Joffrey developed a severe, treatment-resistant infection, requiring strong antibiotics and continued intensive care. He remains at the center as he continues to heal. Through his time there, we are happy to report that the largest wound on his frail,

little body has began shrinking in size and his infection is clearing up. However, the veterinary team is concerned with one of his elbows as it does not appear to be healing properly. They believe a skin graft may be in order and are unsure at this time how much mobility he will have in that leg. Despite all of his pain and suffering, Joffrey still wants to do nothing more than curl up in your lap and receive love and pets.

As a no-kill animal welfare agency, we are committed to valuing and protecting all animals from suffering. Joffrey's strength and resilience inspire us to do everything we can to help him fully recover, but we can't do it alone. The OSU Veterinary Center generously covered a large portion of the cost around his procedures, but thanks to all of your support we have raised additional funding to cover the rest of Joffrey's extensive, specialized care. No creature should endure the cruelty Joffrey has faced, but thanks to you we can ensure he receives the best care possible. He isn't out of the woods yet, but we are honored to be able to show Joffrey that there is still love and kindness in this world. Thank you for your support!
